ADELANTE

Provides educational opportunities for economically disadvantaged students from local junior and senior high schools. Students in grades 8 through 12 may participate in non-credit classes each summer on the SRJC Santa Rosa campus. Participating students primarily come from families with migrant worker parents. The word "adelante" means "forward," and is intended to communicate strongly to students involved in the Adelante Summer Education Program that they can move forward after high school to college. APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS

Combines on-the-job training with academic instruction for those students entering the workforce.
